Subject HTLV-III/LAV Note Book Entries (Jan.-April, 1984)

To Dr. Bob Gallo

It is evident from my notebooks that from January through mid-April, 1984, I used LAV as a generic term (see "Entry List"). I was instructed by Mika in January to use this term. I continued to use it generically till mid-April for all preparations I received, regardless of the source, and identifying the sources by sub-disgnations. For example, even the preparations I received from Zaki in late March and early April, I entered as LAV (PZ)-even though I was told that the Phil-Zaki virus had a different source than Mika virus. On March 16th, when Mika and I worked together again on a virus preparation, he neglected to correct me or instruct me otherwise. He thinks that he probably gave me the virus preparation without any label or instruction, and I entered it as LAV, as would be customary for me to do. This is reasonable and possible.

The first time I used the term HTLV-III is on April 12, 1984, when I received a preparation from BioTech so labeled. The subsequent preparations from BioTech or Electronucleonics were labeled HTLV-III and I entered them in my notebooks as such. It is in April that Flossie and I drafted our homologies manuscript to Science which was submitted on May 1st, and when the need to use the proper scientific term (HTLV-III) rather than a generic term formally became necessary. Among my colleagues, it was Flossie who first instructed me on the use of the term HTLV-III. It may be noteworthy that on April 20, 1984, I used the terms HTLV-III, MOV, and LAV simultaneously for the same preparations which were originally entered as LAV (MOV) on March 29 and April 15. Since I was not involved in retrovirology prior to January 1984, it is perhaps not suprising that I continued to use the generic term till we wrote our paper or received preparations labeled HTLV-III.

I am providing the copies of my "Entry List" to Mika, Sarang, Bob Ting, Zaki, and Flossie so that they may help in tracing the lineage of the preparations I received.
