I very much appreciated your exceptional patience in listening to a complex story, and more so, I admire and welcome your attempt to gain a better understanding.

As we discussed, I am enclosing a few items.

- (1) The HBO piece by Boyce Rensberger of the Washington Post.
- (2) Earlier pieces by Malcolm Gladwell:
  - (a) on my colleague Popovic (magazine section).
  - (b) on my earlier "exoneration" on the key issues.
- (3) The Appeals Panel & Judge's decision on Popovic which was just released and which I think tells a great story about the tragedy of Popovic, and which I hope Time will see interest in.
- (4) The 1987 science history agreement (Montagnier and myself).
- (5) The 1991 letter I wrote to <u>Nature</u> in which I supposedly admitted some kind of taking of the "French" virus.
- (6) The 1988 interview Montagnier gave to OMNI, though neglecting to clarify the fact that I had many isolates of HIV (not just the contaminant), and neglecting to point out my contributions to his 1983 <a href="Science">Science</a> paper in the form of providing the basic idea and the technology to grow T cells, nonetheless, <a href="maintains">maintains</a> (by Montagnier) that I was a co-discoverer based on our demonstrating HIV was (is) the cause of AIDS.
- (7) My book "Virus Hunting".

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I hope you have time to look these over, especially #1 and #2. I will also send you a letter signed by Mr. Joseph Onek, my attorney, which I hope Time will publish.

Finally, in a few days I know there will be a major article which will be further revealing of the unfair harm done to us which I will send you. Also, we will have information about where things are going. Consequently, I will try to reach Dick Thompson and Christine, or you in a few days.
